

Abstract

The Overview of Contraceptive and Condom Shipments is an annual publication summarizing contraceptive and condom shipments sponsored by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) by value and unit.

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Overview of Contraceptive and Condom Shipments

The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) has provided commodities for family planning and reproductive health activities since the mid-1960s. Thanks to USAID and other international donors, the use rates for contraceptives and condoms have increased in most parts of the world. In fiscal year (FY) 2013, USAID continued to respond to the increasing need for foreign assistance by providing family planning and reproductive health commodities to Missions in all five of the agency's regions: Africa, Asia, Europe and Eurasia (E&E), Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC), and the Middle East.


In 1990, to support this worldwide effort, a centralized system—the Central Contraceptive Procurement Project—was created to provide contraceptives and condoms needed in USAID's field programs. The Commodities Security and Logistics (CSL) Division of USAID's Office of Population and Reproductive Health was tasked with administering this system. The division works with country programs and other donors to provide technical leadership, ensure that commodities are available to anyone who wants to use them, support a program for improved supply chain design and logistics management in developing countries, and maintain a database for USAID commodity assistance.

USAID Missions determine the quantity and type of contraceptives and condoms required for their programming; they place orders with the CSL division for these commodities. This report includes details of data gathered in FY 2013 on those contraceptive and condom shipments. The data are divided by the worldwide overview, USAID region, and commodity type. The report provides details on both the values and quantities of shipments from FY 2011–2013. It should be noted that one-year fluctuations in contraceptive and condom shipments at the regional and country levels do not necessarily result from programmatic shifts. In fact, variations in country supply plans and shipment schedules from one year to the next often account for these fluctuations.


Commodity Fund

The Commodity Fund (CF) provides central funding to procure male and female condoms for HIV/AIDS programs and it ensures their expedited delivery to USAID-supported countries. Since its inception in FY 2002, the annual funding for the CF has ranged from \$10.1 million to \$31.9 million. In FY 2013, the funding allocated to the CF totaled \$23.5 million.

The value of condom orders that the CF shipped and paid for in FY 2013 totaled \$17.5 million. Of that, 78 percent of the value was for male condoms and 22 percent was for female condoms; this compares to the FY 2012 breakdown of 66 percent and 34 percent, respectively.



Worldwide Contraceptive and Condom Shipments



- The worldwide 10-year trend for both contraceptives and condoms (male and female) is upward, even though the value shipped worldwide in FY 2013 was lower than both FY 2012 and 2011 (see figure 1).




Figure 2. Worldwide Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values by Method, FY 2013

- The historical trend of USAID focusing resources to regions with the greatest need continued with Africa receiving the majority of worldwide shipment values followed by Asia, LAC, E&E, and the Middle East (see figure 2).
- While the Middle East, LAC, and E&E showed the largest increase in value over the last year, the value shipped for these regions represents only 4.5 percent of the total shipment value in FY 2013 (see figure 2 and table 1).




Figure 3. Worldwide Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values by Method, FY 2013

- For the first time in three years, male condom shipment values held the largest share of commodity values shipped worldwide; previously injectables were the largest share of shipments (see figure 3 and table 2).
- Although the value of intrauterine device (IUD) shipments remain as the lowest share of worldwide contraceptive and condom shipments, the value of IUDs shipped more than doubled over last year (see table 2). This increasing trend is largely due to orders for Pakistan.
- FY 2013 contraceptive implant shipments reflect a decrease in the value and an increase in the quantity shipped, attributable to a reduction in the unit price (see tables 2 and 3).
- Governmental programs continued to be the type of program receiving the majority of contraceptive and condom shipments in FY 2013, followed by social marketing and nongovernmental organization (NGO) programs (see figure 4).






Figure 5. Worldwide Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values by Method, FY 2013

- Governmental shipment values worldwide have risen since FY 2010 (see figure 5). This is largely due to the significant support to Asia—Pakistan in particular—and to Africa.
- Support to worldwide NGOs has diminished over recent years, a downward trend seen in all regions except LAC (see figures 5 and 20).

Figure 1. Trends in Worldwide Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values, FY 2004-2013



Figure 4. Worldwide Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values by Method, FY 2013

Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to Africa



- As seen earlier in figure 2, Africa is the region that receives the greatest amount of USAID shipment support. While slightly less than FY 2011 and 2012, the value of shipments in FY 2013 was nearly \$73 million. Over 10 years, the shipment values to Africa have been increasing; much of the upward trend is due to contraceptive shipments as the condom (male and female) shipments have only a minimal upward trend (see figure 6 and table 4).




Figure 7. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Africa by Method, FY 2013

- The method mix, by value, is well distributed in this region, with the exception of IUDs, which represent only one percent of the value shipped (see figure 7).





Figure 8. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Africa: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- In FY 2013, Uganda requested the largest value of shipments, which was an increase over the previous year (see figure 8 and table 4). Zimbabwe, Kenya, Malawi, and Tanzania follow Uganda as major recipients of shipments in FY 2013 and all, except for Tanzania, also show an increase over the past three years. Tanzania had an increased value shipped over FY 2012; however, it was much less than FY 2011 when a large portion of shipments were procured by USAID with the United Kingdom's Department for International Development (DFID) funding.
- Ethiopia and Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) have seen a large decline in shipment values in FY 2013 due to decreased order requests from Ethiopia and DRC (see table 4).
- Governmental programs in Africa returned to the top program type, receiving 53 percent of shipment values—the largest share in FY 2013 (see figure 9).





Figure 10. Africa Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2004–2013

- Africa has nearly equal support to governmental and social marketing programs over recent years, though there is a marked upward trend in support to governmental; less so for social marketing (see figure 10).

Figure 6. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Africa, FY 2004–2013

Figure 9. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: Africa, FY 2013

Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to Asia



- Shipment values to the Asia region have shown a dramatic increase since FY 2010 with a large jump in FY 2011 which is notably because of support to Bangladesh and Pakistan (see figure 11 and table 5).




Figure 12. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Asia by Method, FY 2013

- Male condoms represent half of the support to the region in FY 2013, driven by the very large shipments to Pakistan (see figure 12).
- Male condom and IUD shipment values to the region increased more than twofold over FY 2012 while implants were not represented in the method mix in FY 2013 (see figure 12, tables 9 and 14).





Figure 13. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Asia: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- A shift in focus within the region is apparent with a sharp decline in shipment values to Bangladesh and a great increase to Pakistan which accounted for 85 percent of shipments to Asia in FY 2013 (see figure 13 and table 5). In addition to Bangladesh, Myanmar, Thailand, and Vietnam have also seen a decline in shipments in recent years.
- Shipment values to governmental recipients in Asia represent 81 percent of the program types in FY 2013, mostly attributable to Pakistan shipments as well as a minimal amount for Afghanistan and Nepal. The 19 percent balance in value shipped represents social marketing shipments to all countries in the region, except for Afghanistan (see figure 14).






Figure 15. Asia Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2004–2013

- The 10-year trend for program type reflects a decrease to social marketing programs in Bangladesh and a refocus of support to Pakistan governmental programs (see figure 15).

Figure 11. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to Asia, FY 2004–2013

Figure 14. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: Asia, FY 2013

Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to Latin America and the Caribbean



- In spite of an overall decrease in shipment value to the LAC region over the past 10 years due to programs graduating from USAID support, FY 2013 showed a 35 percent increase over FY 2012 (see figure 16 and table 6).




Figure 17. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to LAC by Method, FY 2013

- Male condoms represent the largest value shipped to the region, most of which are for Haiti, followed by the Dominican Republic. Nearly a quarter of the value shipped was for injectables, mostly directed to Haiti (see figure 17 and table 6).





Figure 18. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to LAC: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- Haiti requested the greatest shipment values to the region in FY 2013, as it continues to receive USAID support following the devastating earthquake of 2010 (see figure 18).
- Both Haiti and the Dominican Republic requested an increase in shipment value over FY 2012, as did Jamaica, which requested a small shipment for the first time in six years. These shipments contributed to the overall increase to the region. The remaining countries in the region have decreasing shipment values compared to FY 2012.
- In FY 2013, NGOs continued to receive the majority of shipment values directed to the region, accounting for 69 percent of shipments. Social marketing programs followed with 31 percent while governmental programs received less than one percent (see figure 19).




Figure 20. LAC Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2004–2013

- LAC shows a continuing trend of increasing shipments to NGO programs, with a decreasing 10-year trend to social marketing programs. There has also been a dramatic decrease in support to governmental programs since FY 2007, currently receiving less than one percent of total value shipped (see figure 20). This reflects a change in focus as USAID-supported countries and programs graduate from USAID support.

Figure 16. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to LAC, FY 2004–2013

Figure 19. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: LAC, FY 2013

Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to Europe and Eurasia



- While shipment support to the E&E region has been inconsistent over the past 10 years, in the 3 most recent years small contraceptive and condom values were shipped to this region (see figure 21).




Figure 22. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to E&E by Method, FY 2013

- Although overall shipment values to the region were small, several methods were represented. The greatest value requested was for orals, though there were requests for contraceptive implants, male condoms, and IUDs as well (see figure 22).





Figure 23. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to E&E: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- Georgia has been the sole recipient of shipments over the past three years, with the exception of a small shipment for Armenia in FY 2013 (see figure 23 and table 7).
- The region had shipments at a total value of \$0.27 million in FY 2013, almost exclusively for governmental programs in Georgia, with one percent for an NGO program in Armenia (see figure 24).





Figure 25. E&E Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2004–2013

- Support to the region was largely directed to NGOs until FY 2011, when NGO shipments ceased and significantly lower shipment values were then directed to governmental programs (see figure 25).

Figure 21. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to E&E, FY 2004–2013

Figure 24. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: E&E, FY 2013

Contraceptive and Condom Shipments to the Middle East



- Shipment values to the Middle East follow the declining trend seen over the past 10 years with very small or no shipments from FY 2008 forward (see figure 26).




Figure 27. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to the Middle East by Method, FY 2013





Figure 28. Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to the Middle East: Major Receiving Country, FY 2013

- In the region, only Jordan requested shipments in FY 2012 and FY 2013, for injectables and contraceptive implants, respectively. There were no shipments to Jordan in FY 2011, but the values increased from FY 2012 to FY 2013 (see figures 27 and 28 and table 8).






Figure 30. Middle East Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type, FY 2004–2013

- Since FY 2008, support to the region has been directed to governmental programs (see figures 29 and 30).

Figure 26. Trends in Contraceptive & Condom Shipment Values to the Middle East, FY 2004–2013

Figure 29. Contraceptive & Condom Shipments by Program Type: Middle East, FY 2013

Worldwide Male Condom Shipments



- Male condom shipments continued on an upward trend with nearly one billion shipped in FY 2013 (see figure 31). This trend is largely related to orders for Pakistan since FY 2010.




Figure 32. Male Condom Shipment Values by Region, FY 2013

- All regions except for the Middle East requested shipments of male condoms; Africa accounted for 51 percent of male condom shipment values, a small decrease from FY 2012 (see figure 32 and table 9).





Figure 33. Male Condom Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- In continued support to Pakistan, there were very large quantities of condoms requested over the past four years, reaching a high of 378 million in FY 2013—37 percent of all condom shipment values (see figure 33).
- Angola has an increasing trend in shipment quantities over recent years, and a 61 percent increase in value over last year (see table 9).
- Uganda condom shipments have shown a dramatic year-to-year increase in recent years attributable to increased support to the Ministry of Health (see table 9).
- While Malawi and South Africa show an increasing trend in condom requests over the past three years and a greater than 100 percent shipment increase over last year, there is not an apparent upward trend for overall values shipped during the past six years (see table 9).
- Togo had increasing shipment quantities over the past two years, associated with increased orders to a PSI program and support to the Ministry of Health (see table 9).

Figure 31. Trends in Worldwide Male Condom Shipments, FY 2004–2013



Worldwide Female Condom Shipments



- While there is considerable variation year-to-year, female condom shipments continue to show an overall upward trend over the past 10 years (see figure 34).
- A significant decline this year over FY 2012 was seen as Africa, Asia, and LAC showed a decrease in orders for female condoms. The decline was greatly due to the DRC and South Africa having no shipments in this fiscal year (see table 10); this is the first time the DRC has not received any female condom shipments since FY 2002, and since FY 2008 for South Africa.




Figure 35. Female Condom Shipment Values by Region, FY 2013

- Africa continued to be the greatest recipient of this method, receiving 95 percent of shipment values; small quantities were shipped to the Asia and LAC regions— together totaling only five percent of the total value shipped (see figure 35).





Figure 36. Female Condom Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- Zimbabwe continued to request the greatest value of shipments (see figure 36). Over the past 10 years Zimbabwe requested between 26 and 72 percent of all female condom shipments. Only twice in the past 10 years has another country requested more: Tanzania in FY 2006 and DRC in FY 2012.
- Despite the overall decline in female condom orders from Africa and worldwide, Malawi and Tanzania requested a large increase in shipments in FY 2013. The increase to Tanzania is due to the gap of shipments in FY 2012, while the increase to Malawi is reflecting increased demand for Ministry of Health programs (see table 10).

Figure 34. Trends in Worldwide Female Condom Shipments, FY 2004–2013

Worldwide Oral Contraceptive Shipments



- The past 10 years of oral contraceptive shipments show a gradual decline in quantities shipped (see figure 37).




Figure 38. Oral Contraceptive Shipment Values by Region, FY 2013

- With a 20 percent increase over FY 2012, Africa continued to request the majority of oral shipment values in FY 2013, followed by Asia, LAC, and E&E (see figure 38 and table 11).





Figure 39. Oral Contraceptive Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- Nigeria has shown an increasing trend over the past three years, requesting the largest share of oral shipments in FY 2013 (see figure 39).
- There was a significant increase in requests from Malawi in FY 2013 over the prior two years and Kenya received the first oral contraceptive shipment in three years (see table 11).
- Mozambique has decreased orders over the past three years, down to zero in FY 2013, reflecting an increase in contributions from the Ministry of Health and other donors (see table 11).
- While Madagascar shows a significant shipment increase this year over last, a look at three years of shipment totals does not show a particular trend in oral contraceptive shipments for Madagascar (see table 11).
- Although three out of four USAID regions showed an increase in oral shipments over FY 2013, worldwide there was a 10 percent decrease in value shipped; this is attributable to the large decline in oral contraceptives shipped to Asia (see table 11).
- Pakistan is the country with the second largest total oral orders of all countries this year, and has been a major recipient for the most recent three years. Bangladesh, by contrast, shows significantly reduced shipments over the past three years—with no shipments in FY 2013 (see table 11).
- In the LAC region, Haiti shows a significant shipment increase this year over last. However, a look at three years of shipment totals does not show a notable trend in oral contraceptive shipments to Haiti (see table 11).

Figure 37. Trends in Worldwide Oral Contraceptive Shipments, FY 2004–2013



Worldwide Injectable Contraceptive Shipments



- The 10-year trend for injectable contraceptives continues upward. However, a look at the past three years suggests that shipment totals may be leveling off (see figure 40).




Figure 41. Injectable Contraceptive Shipment Values by Region, FY 2013

- At 65 percent, Africa had the greatest value of injectable contraceptives shipped in FY 2013, as a number of countries in the region requested shipments of two million vials or more (see figure 41 and table 12).





Figure 42. Injectable Contraceptive Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- Uganda has the greatest shipment value in Africa, and 14 percent of the total shipped worldwide (see figure 42).
- Kenya, Madagascar, and Malawi have increasing order quantities over the past three years as there have been larger requests from the public sector in Kenya, social marketing sector in Madagascar, and both in Malawi; Kenya and Madagascar represent 12 and 8 percent of all FY 2013 injectables shipped (see table 12).
- After recent increases in requests from Ghana and Nigeria, FY 2013 resulted in no injectable shipments to these two African countries due to availability of stock in-country. Additionally, Tanzania and Zambia have seen a general decline the past three years with a 100 percent and 48 percent value decrease in FY 2013 from FY 2012, respectively (see table 12).
- A large portion of injectable shipment values were requested by Asia in FY 2013—with 25 percent of the worldwide value going to Pakistan (see table 12).
- Focus within Asia has shifted from Bangladesh to Pakistan. Bangladesh did not request any injectable shipments in FY 2013 while Pakistan's orders increased greatly over both FY 2011 and FY 2012. The large increase to Pakistan, in addition to minor increases to Afghanistan and Nepal, account for the overall increase in shipments to Asia (see table 12).
- Support to LAC continued with only Haiti receiving injectables. After two consecutive years of shipments, Honduras did not request any shipments in FY 2013 (see table 12).

Figure 40. Trends in Worldwide Injectable Contraceptive Shipments, FY 2004–2013

Worldwide Contraceptive Implant Shipments



- The quantity of contraceptive implants shipped has shown a dramatic increasing trend over the past 10 years (see figure 43). While the overall value shipped dropped in FY 2013 from FY 2012 due to a decrease in the price of implants, the quantity increased by 3.5 percent (see table 13).




Figure 44. Contraceptive Implant Shipment Values by Region, FY 2013

- All regions, except for Asia, requested implant shipments in FY 2013. Orders to Africa represented 98 percent of the total value for all contraceptive implants shipped (see figure 44).





Figure 45. Contraceptive Implant Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- Uganda, Tanzania, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, and Madagascar received the largest value of shipments, totaling 70 percent of values shipped worldwide (see figure 45).
- Angola, DRC, Ghana, Guinea, and Uganda all had increasing orders over the three-year period of FY 2011 to FY 2013 (see table 13).
- Benin and Mali, both after a two-year hiatus, requested contraceptive implants in FY 2013 (see table 13).
- Liberia saw a sevenfold increase over the previous two years as reported consumption for Ministry of Health programs increased (see table 13).
- Ethiopia, previously the country receiving the largest quantity of implants, has had decreasing orders in recent years (see table 13).
- After two consecutive years of shipments to Cambodia and Pakistan and one year to Bangladesh, there were no implant orders from the Asia region (see table 13).
- FY 2013 is the first year Jordan in the Middle East received implant shipments since FY 2002 and also the first year for Georgia in the E&E to receive a shipment of implants (see table 13).

Figure 43. Trends in Worldwide Contraceptive Implant Shipments, FY 2004–2013

- The increase in IUD shipments seen since FY 2008 continued with quantities shipped reaching the highest level this year than any of the past 10 years (see figure 46).




Figure 47. Intrauterine Device Shipment Values by Region, FY 2013

- IUDs were requested by four regions in FY 2013; Asia received the majority of shipment values followed by Africa; E&E and LAC together received less than one percent of shipment values (see figure 47).





Figure 48. Intrauterine Device Shipment Values Worldwide: Major Receiving Countries, FY 2013

- The high value of IUDs shipped over the past three years is greatly due to large and increasing orders from Pakistan. In FY 2013, shipments to Pakistan represented 66 percent of the worldwide total and nearly all of the shipments to Asia (see figure 48 and table 14).
- In Africa, Kenya showed a significant decrease in quantity, but increase in value of this method. This was due to a one-off procurement of IUD kits instead of the standard IUD (see table 14).
- There has been a noted increase in shipments requested by Uganda, Guinea, Sierra Leone, and Togo. Both Mali and Benin received the first shipment of IUDs in three years (see table 14).
- While there have been significant shipments to Nigeria and Zambia in prior years, there were no shipments this year (see table 14).
- There were shipments to one country each in the E&E and LAC regions, Georgia and Haiti, respectively, and no shipments to the Middle East in FY 2013 (see table 14).

Figure 46. Trends in Worldwide Intrauterine Device Shipments, FY 2004–2013
